

Genesis 3

- 1) Who is the serpent in the chapter? (Satan—Is.27:1/Ezekiel 28:12-19 / IICor.11:3,13-15 / Rev.20:1-3)
- 2) How does the serpent seek to deceive the woman? (v.1-questions God’s word “Yea, hath God said…” v.4-denies the truthfulness of God’s word “Ye shall not surely die”)
- 3) What was wrong with what the woman said unto the serpent in vs.2-3? (She misquotes the LORD. She left out the word “freely” (2:16) in v.2 and added to the word of God in v.3 “neither shall ye touch it”—God didn’t say they couldn’t touch it.)
- 4) How is v.7 an example of human religion? (they sought to make a covering for themselves out of fig leaves—example of trying to deal with our sin predicament through our own efforts)
- 5) What did Adam and Eve do when they heard the voice of the LORD God in v.8?
- 6) Did Adam and Eve take responsibility for their actions? (vs.9-13)
- 7) Who is the “seed of the woman” that will bruise the serpent’s head in v15? (the Lord Jesus Christ—Ps.68:21/Hab.3:13/Rm.16:20)
- 8) What are the results of Adam’s transgression? (vs.16-19 / Romans 5&8)
- 9) What is a principle that the LORD was teaching Adam and Eve after the fall through the “coats of skins” that the LORD made for them in v.21? (Heb.9:22/Lev.17:11,14)
- 10) After God drove the man out of the garden of Eden what did God do to prevent man from partaking of the tree of life? (vs.23-24)
